"God of Life, Lead Us to Justice and Peace"

After several hours of what Moderator Walter Altmann called "Intense dialogue," the World Council of Churches Central Committee decided on 22 February on a theme for the WCC's 10th Assembly: "God of Life, Lead Us to Justice and Peace."

The theme - very clear and contextual

"During the discussion on the theme at WCC Central Committee, there was a long discussion, most of them favouring to combine both themes "God of life-Lead Us to Justice and Peace" and "In God's World, Called to be One", to make the "Unity" aspect more visible. In the decision making session there came up about 5 new suggestions with change of words to combine the two."

The theme of 10th assembly of the W.C.C. to be held in South Korea in 2013 is very relevant. All our Churches should study this theme and discuss at length the implication and relevance of these themes. Many Churches and youth groups around the world discuss the same theme from now on so that at the W.C.C. assembly in South Korea some learned discussions can take place and conclusions needed.

Our Church should appoint a capable representative to prepare the relevant studies and participate meaningfully in the assembly. During the last assembly in Porto Alegre, Brazil in 2005 W.C.C. did not elect anybody from our Church to the Central Committee. In the previous assembly at Zimbabwe in 1998 also nobody was elected to the Central committee. In the previous assembly in Australia I do not know whether any of our delegates was elected to the Central Committee.

Since our strength is small we are ignored. But let us pray that we are not ignored in the next assembly in 2013.

The Holy Feast of the Resurrection of
our Lord Jesus Christ – 2011

Our Beloved Brothers The Prelates, our Spiritual Sons the Pure Priests, The Honorable Deacons, all the Sons and Daughters of The Holy Church, the Assyrian Nation and all Christians of the world:

Prayers and Blessings receive:

Today the Holy Church is celebrating the Great Feast of the Holy Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from among the dead and conveys the good news of the Salvation to her spiritual Sons and daughters all over the world. By His Resurrection He, Jesus gave us the Hope of redemption. He enlightened the world which was taking the dark path of error, prepared by Satan in order to cause Mankind fall in the sea of Sin. Our Lord the good shepherd laid down His life and saved the Mankind from the death of sin. He enlightened the path of truth which leads to life eternal. Jesus says: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

Christ is risen from among the dead. He will not die again and death will have no power over Him. By His resurrection from among the dead, He demolished the authority of sin and has released the curse laid upon human race. The Lord provided freedom to the captives of sin. Our Lord by His death on the Cross slaughtered the sin of Adam, rejoiced those who were saddened, gathered those who were scattered and brought back those who were walking on the dark path of sin onto the bright path of truth. Our Lord Jesus says: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6)

On the Sunday of the Holy Resurrection our Lord Jesus Christ shuddered the gates of sheol. The Feast of the Holy Resurrection marks the beginning of the Salvation of Mankind. Because of our Salvation, He Jesus for three days went down into sheol and stood upon the sea of mortality. As a fisherman of men He cast down His net, filled it with saved people and pulled it out. He is the first who rose from among the dead and commanded death to preserve the dead bodies of human race until the second coming of the Lord who will come and liberate them.

We are bound to accept the physical death. It is a decree of God that all human race should test death. Thus man can die with many different causes. Jesus has given us the hope of the resurrection from among the dead. Jesus is risen from among the dead and lives forever. All the Christians must celebrate the Feast of the Resurrection of the Lord with joy and happiness. It is a great feast and the fame of all other feasts. On this day a great joy is given to the Church. This is the reason we say to you all, O Sons and Daughters of The Holy Church, the Assyrian Nation and all Christians of the world:

The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ be blessed unto you all:

Let us rejoice by the Resurrection of our Lord, the good shepherd. By His Resurrection the new and eternal life was given to us. The Church received the great joy from the love of God The father by sending His only begotten Son for the Salvation of the human race. By His Holy Resurrection, He shone the Sun of righteousness and enlightened the wrong thoughts of mankind. By His blood He wrote and sealed the covenant of freedom from death and gave it to mankind. It is written: "Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" (Romans 6:3)

Baptism is the second birth from water and the Holy Spirit. Our Lord said to Nicodemus: "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again" "How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!" Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You's! must be born again." (John 3:3-7) After the Holy Baptism the sons and daughters are nurtured with the spiritual nourishment of the Body and Blood of the Lord for the remission of sins, the great hope of the Resurrection from among the dead and the eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven.

As food is essential for the nourishment of the physical bodies so is the spiritual nourishment of the Body and Blood of our Lord is essential for the nourishment of the baptized people. Our Lord says: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world." Then the Jews began to argue sharply among themselves, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. ⁵³ For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. ⁵⁷ Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." (John 6:51-58)

The fathers of the Holy Church have likened the Church unto a boat that carries the faithful believers of Jesus Christ to the port of peace. We request all sons and daughters

of the Assyrian Church of the east to faithfully participate in the Church. The boat of the Holy Church is lead by the wise captain our lord Jesus Christ who will safely guide her towards the Kingdom of Heaven. Our Lord prays to the father saying: "Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you loved me before the creation of the world"." (John 17:24).

You have learned how much love our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has for us. When our Lord Jesus Christ comes for the second time, He will raise all the dead. He will judge all and will separate those who are good from those who are wicked. He will take the good unto heaven where He Himself is so that they experience the glory that has been given to the Lord by His heavenly father.

When we are talking about the Church, we are talking about the great assembly of the faithful believers. All the members of the Holy Church are united together in one mystical body the Church. The head and the Lord of the body of the Church is our Lord Jesus Christ. He died in His humanity and was brought to life for the Salvation of the Church. Therefore it is important that we, the faithful believers should love Him, honor Him and maintain His Commandments so that the edifice of our faith be strong and pure.

When a faithful believer is truthful in his faith and Messianic teaching and has good deeds will receive the grace of God. "Was not our father Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called God's friend. You see that a person is considered righteous by what they do and not by faith alone. In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction? As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead." (James 2:21-26)

Saint Paul the Apostle writes: "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." (Rom.10:17). You should not be exhausted of hearing the life giving words of God that will keep you from falling into the snares of the wicked one. Jesus Christ says to His disciples: "Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work." (John 14:10)

We are learning from the Sacred Scriptures that the words spoken by Jesus Christ are from God Himself. These words are likened to a good seed planted in a rich field and producing good and delicious fruits. Such a field is praised and blessed by God. However the field that brings forth thorns is disgraced and cursed by God. We hope that all the Sons and daughters of the Holy Church will consider becoming the rich field that produces good and delicious fruits to the Lord of the field our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. People as such will receive praise and blessings from God. Our Lord has called us into His Church in order to work together faithfully and in obedience as members of one household.

Every member of the Holy Church must build the edifice of his faith upon Jesus Christ because He Jesus is the rock of the foundation of the Church. Thus the edifice of a Christian individual that is build upon Jesus Christ it will stay strong and will never fall. However whoever builds the edifice of his faith upon certain individuals, his faith will be considered a manmade faith not Christian. Since individuals are mortals therefore the faith that is build on them will become mortal as well. Our Lord Jesus Christ is eternally alive; He is our God, our Lord, our King, our Savior and the forgiver of our lives. Our Lord said to His disciples: "Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant," (Matthew 20:26)

We the Prelates, Priests and the Deacons who have been chosen and called by our Lord and has given us a spiritual authority to labor in His Church are the mediators between our Lord and you. We are commissioned by the Lord to deliver to you His words and His commandments. Since His life-giving words are the rock of the foundation of your faith, you are bound to receive them, be obedient to them and keep them. The edifice of your faith should be also decorated by fasting, prayers, purity, humbleness, mercifulness, love and peace. Our Lord Jesus Christ has set a good example for us. He observed fasting in order to teach us to fast. He forgave and taught us to forgive, He humbled Himself and taught us to be humble, He loved us and taught us to love one another. Therefore if we want to live in this temporal world in joy and happiness we must keep the Commandments of our Lord.

We expect the Prelates and the Priests of our Holy Church to establish the following ministries within their parishes and diocese: 1- Sunday school where the children are taught prayers and Messianic teachings of our Holy Church. 2- The youth association where the youth are taught prayers, Messianic teaching, Aramaic language, Assyrian Language, History of our Holy Church, Liturgy and the Sacraments of our Holy Church. 3- In each parish there must be Bible study once a week for adults. 4- Teaching programs must be offered for the youth and other members of the Holy Church who are interested in learning the Assyrian and Aramaic language in order to join the choir.

In each parish some faithful members should be chosen and elected in order to work as active members of the church councils and sub-committees under the spiritual guidance and supervision of the diocesan bishop. These members of the councils and sub-committees are assistants to the parish Priest. Those sons and daughters of the Holy Church who have faith and love to work in the parishes must be official members of the Assyrian Church of the east. They must also have good reputation within the parish.

They must be faithful and obedient to the Synodical canons of our Church and the commandments of God.

O, spiritual Sons and Daughters of our Holy Church, where ever you reside, do not forget that you are members of The Holy Apostolic Catholic Assyrian Church of the East. We instruct the faithful believers to be devoted, obedient, and truthful to the Church and actively involved in The Church ministries. With all diligence keep the holy faith, her worship liturgy, Holy Sacraments, and the Apostolic Traditions which you have received; together with, the Synodical Decrees of The Church.

We ask of you all, as faithful believers, in the nation where you reside, be faithful to the rules and leaders of the land who have been set over you. Once again, be diligent; and, take care to abide in faithful obedience to the laws of the land. We direct all the faithful believers to honor, be in love, peace, and respect to your neighbors; they will likewise respect you. It is written: "love your neighbors as yourselves." (Luke 10:27)

In conclusion, once again, we write to you all, rejoicing and declaring: May the Feast of the Resurrection be richly blessed unto you all! We beseech our worshipful Lord and God to keep you all in His love, blessed with good health and joy. We hope and pray O beloved Sons and Daughters of the Holy Church that you will celebrate this holy feast of the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in all peace and joy. Where ever you dwell, together with the all of our Christian brothers and sisters throughout the whole world. 

Mayor Saves Historic Assyrian Church

Turlock, California — Turlock's earliest Assyrian church, set for demolition, was saved this week by the efforts of Turlock Mayor John Lazar.

"I couldn't see it being torn down," Lazar said. "It was part of Turlock's history."

The church, initially built in 1923 for Assyrians of all denominations, became the site of Crane

Elementary School when sold to the Turlock Unified School District in the 1950s. For years, the building was used as the school cafeteria.

Even as Crane Elementary School's mission changed in recent years, shifting from a traditional elementary to a kindergarten-only facility and then into the site of TUSD's Head Start preschool program, the building remained a campus fixture. But the newest plan — to repurpose the campus as the eCademy charter school beginning in fall 2011 — calls for the demolition of the old cafeteria as part of a \$2.65 million makeover,



approved by the TUSD Board Trustees on Aug. 24, 2010. As Lazar attended that school board meeting, he remembered the building's roots as an Assyrian church."

I had recalled my father had told me that was the church he had attended when he was young, and my grandparents too," Lazar said, who remembered watching home movies showing the church in the building.

Lazar, along with Turlocker Mike Warda, decided to call the TUSD and ask for a temporary reprieve for the building, so that he might be able to move the building to a new home. The district agreed, and on Wednesday the movers came in.

On Thursday, the building was wheeled, ever so slowly, to St. Addai Assyrian Church of the East on Monte Vista Avenue. The new church agreed to house the old church on their land, plunking it down in a parcel initially reserved for the pastor's home.

The permanent site could yet move, Lazar said, depending on the church's space needs. But Lazar has high hopes for the former church, which still appears to feature the original wooden roof and floor.

Lazar hopes to turn the building into a museum for Turlock's Assyrian churches, uniting members of the various Assyrian faiths to create a lasting monument open to all Turlockers.

"Whether or not you're Assyrian, you're going to appreciate the building," Lazar said.

There's much work still to be done. First, while Lazar and Warda paid most of the moving costs, some yet remain. Then it's the hard work of organizing volunteers and refurbishing the old church house. But, for Lazar, the hard work will be worth it.

"I'm very sentimental. I love history, and I love Turlock history and this means a lot to me," Lazar said.

Earthquake in New Zealand

65 people were killed in earth quake in Christchurch, New Zealand on Tuesday 22 February. This is the second largest quake in New Zealand. The first one was in 1931. The famous Blessed Sacrament Cathedral totally destroyed. Many five star hotels also were destroyed. People from Australia are also cooperating in rescue work. About 200 people are under debris. The total death may rise to 200 or 300.

Christchurch is the second largest town in New Zealand. Bishop Mar Awgin Kuriakose of India who is in Auckland telephoned to India to inform that he is safe. Most of the Assyrians and Indians of our Church are in Auckland and Wellington. Bishop Mar Awgin said over the telephone that members of the Church had fasted and conducted *Ba'ootha* prayer on Wednesday 16 February in Auckland.

New Cor-episcopa in Chicago

On Sunday, March 20, 2011 (Third Sunday of Sawma), per the directive (puqdana) of His Holiness Mar Dinkha IV, Bishop Mar Awa Rouvel of California and secretary of the holy Synod ordained Qasha Paulus Benjamin as Cor-bishop for the Patriarchal Diocese of Eastern USA, at Mar Gewargis Cathedral in Chicago.

The new cor-episcopa Paulus Benjamin is from Iran and after his studies in Rome for many years is working as the parish priest of the Mar Gewargis Patriarchal Cathedral in Chicago. This makes two cor episcopas in Chicago, the other being Dr. George Toma, parish priest of St. Andrews Church.

The ordination liturgy began at 9am, on 20 March, and was well attended by hundreds of parishioners from all over Chicago.

At the same service, a young faithful named Esam Youkhanna was ordained as sub-deacon.

Chor Bishop Polos was ordained priest on 13 September, 2001 by His Holiness Mar Dinkha IV, Catholicos-Patriarch, at Mar Gewargis Cathedral in Chicago.

Release of Directory in Ernakulam, India

Dr. Mar Aprem Metropolitan celebrated Holy Qurbana in St. Thomas Church, Ernakulam, Cochin, Kerala on Sunday 20 March During the meeting held afterwards the Metropolitan released the combined Parish Directory of two parishes namely St, Thomas Church in Ernakulam and Mar Slewa Church, Cochin by presenting it to the oldest priest in our Church in India Fr.M.I.David who will be completing 91 years of age in April this year.

The members of the Board of Central Trustees headed by Mr. I. G. Joy, Chairman were given a reception .Metropolitan thanked Fr. K. R. Inasu, Vicar and the Youth Association members who worked hard in producing such a parish Directory with colour photos.

Mar Timotheus Church, Bangalore

Dr. Mar Aprem Metropolitan officiated at the celebrations of the Mar Timotheus Church in Bangalore in Karnataka state on Sunday 27 February 2011. After the dedication of the renovated altar he celebrated Holy Qurbana and released the Parish Directory. He presided over the evening public meeting. Mr. K.J. George MLA and former Minister inaugurated the function.

Metropolitan explained his long association with the Bangalore parish ever since he came to Bangalore as an M.Th.student in 1964. Sister Dr. Jincy was felicitated at this function for her obtaining Ph.D, at the Mahatma Gandhi University.

There were variety entertainments and a professional orchestra.

Future of Iraq

For the first time ever, Christian leaders have formally demanded the creation of a province in the Ninawa Plain, east of Mosul.

No one can predict whether their demand will be met.

Some people are in favour, because it will encourage Christians to stay in the country, while others say that creating such a province will only isolate Christians from other Iraqis.

The demand came three weeks after the bloody attack on the "Our Lady of Deliverance" Church in Baghdad on 31 October 2010.

Others have chosen to leave Iraq and seek shelter elsewhere.

The Niñeva Plain, with an area of more than five thousand square kilometers, equal to both the regions of al-Muthanna and al-Qadisiyah in southern Iraq, is inhibited by more than half a million people.

The area consists of three districts: al-Hamdaniya, Sheekhan and Tallkeef. It is inhibited by a Christian majority, but there are also other ethnicities and followers of other religions such as the Yazidis, the Shabak and some Shiites, Turkmen and Arabs.

Election to NSW Parliament on 26 March 2011

Of four Assyrians running for election to the NSW State Parliament in Australia, Mr. Andrew Rohan, Liberal candidate for Smithfield and member of the Assyrian Church of the East was elected. Other Assyrian candidates in the election were Mr. Ninos Khoshaba (Labor), Mr. Charbel Saliba (Liberal) and Ms. Eileen Nasr (Christian Democrats).

A record swing of 21% Mr Rohan into power as the first Assyrian Liberal to be elected to parliament. Andrew Rohan became the first Liberal candidate to win the seat of Smithfield after 100 years of Labor dominating the area.

Death of Dr.N. V. George, Rugby, England

Dr. N.V. George of Trichur, brother –in-law of Dr. Mar Aprem Metropolitan died of heart attack in Rugby on 14 February. He was 77. After working in India as a doctor he came to London in 1962 to do MRCP. He was the host of Mar Aprem in England whenever he visited England during the past nearly 50 years. Dr. George and his children attended the consecration of the present Patriarch H.H. Mar Dinkha IV in 1976 in Ealing, London. The dead body was taken to Trichur and Mar Aprem Metropolitan conducted the funeral.Dr. George was Senior Specialist in the Department of General Medicine and Geriatrics in St. Cross Hospital in Rugby.
