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Editorial

ARCHBISHOP TUTU

Archbishop Desmond Tutu is the only bishop who received Nobel Prize for peace. He was born and brought up in South Africa. In 1961-62 as a young priest he came to King's College, London, England for higher theological training.

In 16 December 1984 he received Nobel Peace Prize. Tutu was born on 7 October 1931, son of an school teacher. His ambition was to become a doctor. When he was 30 years old he came to King's College, London for post B D studies. In the same year I too was a student in King's College, London. But now I do not recall this my classmate. After his studies in England he returned to his country, i.e., Johannesburg in South Africa. As a priest he began to work for liberation of his people. Nobody from his country had become a bishop. He is the first black bishop in his country in Johannesburg, South Africa. Gradually he became the first black bishop in the Anglican Church in South Africa. In 1976 he became the bishop of Lesotho. Then he moved to Johannesburg as bishop. He then became archbishop of Cape Town.

Archbishop Tutu came to be accepted in many Churches worldwide. He had hard work in his own country that is South Africa. At the same time he became well known all over the world which made him to get Nobel prize for peace. He was popular among South Africa's black majority and was internationally praised for his work involving anti-apartheid activism, for which he won the Nobel Peace Prize and other international awards. He also compiled several books of his speeches and sermons.

Like Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in America, Archbishop Tutu also came to be known outside his own country. Now the death of Archbishop Tutu there is a vacuum in voices that spoke for the poor and marginalized. Most people want to do their duties in their diocese or in their country. There are some priests or bishops who are compelled by their conscience to speak for people outside their parish or diocese.

As the message of Christ is universal we have to think and work for others living outside their parish or diocese also. All preachers do not feel the need to speak for others. But preachers like Martin Luther King Jr. in America and Archbishop Tutu in South Africa some voices are heard in different parts of the world. The numbers of these speakers are not many. Many preachers feel that their calling from God is limited to their own countries.

The death of Archbishop Tutu is a great loss to the Christian World. In every generation God has raised his voice through some preachers. We need more of such preachers to speak for the marginalized people in our times.

Patriarchal Epistle for the Holy Feast of the Nativity 2021

Our venerable brothers of the Holy Synod, the Metropolitans and Bishops; the Reverend Presbyters and the Elect Deacons, and the faithful Children of the Holy Apostolic Catholic Assyrian Church of the East: Receive our prayers and Apostolic Benediction.

It is with great joy that I address to all of the ranks of our holy Church worldwide this our first patriarchal epistle, extending our prayers and felicitations for the holy feast of the Nativity of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is my hope that you are all preserved by divine Providence in good health of body and soul, by which God continually cares for us in His abundant mercies in all generations.

As the holy Church of God once again celebrates on the 25th of December the holy feast of the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ in the flesh, we are once again reminded of the holy and divine economy which was wrought about by God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for the sake of the salvation of the world. In the appropriate time which the Father appointed according to His divine dominion and wisdom, He sent forth in the world the Savior, whom the angel of the Lord referred to as 'Christ the Lord,' that He might save the world from the clutches of the three ancient adversaries of our human race: sin, Satan and death. Therefore, the divine apostle St. Paul states: "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent His Son into the world, and He was born of woman, and became subject to the Law, that He might redeem those who were under the Law, and that we might receive the adoption of sonship" (Galatians 4:4-5).

God the Father sent His Only-Begotten Son, He who was in the bosom of His Begetter above all time, and yet in the fullness of time He took upon Himself a true and complete humanity from the Blessed St. Mary, the Ever-Virgin, in order to liberate us from the Law and the dead works of the old Law. Thus, by the taking of our humanity, the Son of God became one with us in all things, except for sin, and in so doing He demonstrated to us His magnanimous and infinite love. God drew ever closer to His creation in a singular and unique way by the sending forth of His Only-Begotten Son, so that humanity would not remain in despair. Therefore, Christ—who is true God and true Man—became man by the taking on of a true and complete human nature and qnoma, in order to make us "...partakers of the divine nature" according to grace, as a pledge of the true and spiritual life in the Kingdom of God (cf. II Peter 2:4).

Since we have been made worthy of such a great gift which cannot be comprehended, let us offer at every hour complete thanksgiving to the Son of God who was born for our salvation according to His humanity from the Blessed St. Mary. In every season, He is the source of hope for our lives so that in all difficult circumstance we may give thanks to the holy name of God for

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all of His dispensation towards us, and for His manifold graces. In the world in which we live today, there are countless upheavals and strife of every kind, and in these past two years even a horrifying pandemic had spread upon all of humanity, which became the cause of many fatalities and the source of sorrows that presently encompass us. But notwithstanding all of this, we shall never forget that God is the Lord of His creation and retains dominion over all elements and seasons of the earth. Therefore, our God is always victorious and mighty, who also provides for us and is the administrator of our lives. The blessed apostle St. John reminds us that we too are victorious in Christ over all the circumstances and powers of the world: "But you are sons born of God, and you have overcome them. For greater is He that is in you, than he who is in the world" (I John 4:4).

On this holy feast, in which we draw near with true faith and manifold love to Christ who was born as a Child from the Holy Virgin Mother, let us offer unto Him spiritual gifts instead of worldly ones—our love, worship and veneration. In the place of a cave, let us make our hearts for him a dwelling-place befitting the honor of His Godhead. And with the shepherds let us make haste to worship Him with pure love and an undivided devotion. Let us cleanse our hearts from all hatred, wrath and envy, that they may become temples worthy of His majesty. In this way, we shall be able to become true celebrants of the Birth of the Son of God, Who was manifest in the flesh for our salvation.

In conclusion: we extend our greetings for a blessed and holy Feast of the Nativity to all of you, our brothers and children in Christ, and to all of our brethren in Christ worldwide. We pray that God might grant all of you lives filled with every blessing and grace, distant from all kinds of sin and division, and strengthened in the true faith by God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, in every good work of the Spirit and crowned with every Christian virtue. We also extend our prayers for an equally blessed New Year 2022, void of sorrows and filled with the many mercies and blessings of the Lord God to all of the children of our holy Church of the East across the globe, and equally to all men of good will without distinction.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with us all forever and ever; Amen.

Mar Yacob M'pasqa

(Riju Mannukadan, Thrissur)

Friday, November 19, 2021 was the day of remembrance of Mar Yacob M'pasqa in the time cycle of the Church. Parishes are identified in the Church by the name of the saints. But sanctifying a person does not mean naming temples. A person who is exalted in holiness is one who has fulfilled his own life exemplary for others in God. His war is against luxurious, and the power of opposition to the divine faith. Those who have killed themselves in front of others while living like that, and therefore have sacrificed their lives. When we look at the current situation, how far we have come from the above situation. Those who live and die in the name of Christ, keep silent in the face of trouble and declare that I am here. In fact, it is a way of ensuring one's own protection no matter what happens to the movement or belief without offending anyone in one's own faith.

This is where St. Yacob is included in the Church cycle. The day of remembrance of this saint is celebrated in the third week of the sacramental period of the cycle. Exactly, November 19th every year. And in the month of Tishreen 2 in Syriac.

Who was Mar Yacob M'pasqa? Jacob and his family believed in the Lord Jesus and were born into a noble family based on Christianity. Yacob was a General, the position of commander-in-chief in the royal family. The victories of many battles brought Yacob to the peak of his pride. Jacob's life was disrupted by a torrent of gifts from the royal palace. Moreover, he did deny the Lord Jesus, whom he believed to be divine. His mother and wife were devastated by Jacob's change of heart, which followed a perfectly godly way of life. They sent letters to Jacob for a change from this apostasy. These letters inspired Jacob to bring out the fear of God that lurked within him.

The Church later sanctified in principle a man who, at a time when the inner divine thoughts were being suppressed, was enslaved to satanic thoughts from Christian values and was ready to deny Christ at the temptation of the king in his official life.

The attitude of these fathers may seem strange to the new generation. But the observance of this saint's remembrance is a direct reflection of the fact that these Fathers always paid attention to remind mankind that the change of repentance and the consequent return to Christ were exemplary for mankind. Thoughts from a letter were redirected to the Lord Jesus, whom he believed in and worshiped. His eyes, which were demonically closed, were opened. With the same eyes, he prepared himself for a return to being enslaved to divine thoughts through the path of meditation. He shouted in military uniform that he was a Christian.

As a general before the king; When he defies the king's order to destroy the Christian faith and challenges before the king; The resulting monarchy is unpredictable. The king initially advised him to withdraw from the Christian faith. Then threatened. But Yacob stood firm in his unshakable faith in Christ. The king was compelled to issue an edict for his commander's

disobedience. The King's enmity towards Christ was also reflected in the way he took the life of Yacob. The king ordered that the fingers and toes of the hands and feet be cut off and then beheaded. We can only imagine the mental and physical stress that Jacob faced. If he changed the words, would Jacob have had this fate? What would our society, which is currently self-fulfilling, call Jacob? Who will doubt that he is stupid?

He stood firmly in his belief that he would believe in Christ and live in death. Before being slaughtered, he turned to the East and prayed to his living God. He dedicated his life to God. The king's anger increased. Yacob was surrounded by soldiers. His fellow soldiers also finally advised their boss. The commander, who saw death face to face, had no qualms.

He was dismembered into 28 parts from his body. And then beheaded. Took Jacob's life. The faithful Christian people paid the soldiers and collected 28 parts of his body in a basket. They prayed for the spirit of Jacob by singing Psalm 51 of Repentance in the Holy Scriptures. The fire flowed from the sky and received the blood that came down from the 28 cut parts. These pieces were ignited by intense light. Believers praised the Lord God. Our forefathers had no doubt as to how a Christian should accept the history of Yacob. The Church proclaimed Jacob a saint and called for the observance of his Memorial Day on November 19 every year, according to the chronology. The word "M'pasqa" means broken. Yacob, who was broken. Mar Yacob M'Pasqa. Our church in Peechi is also named after him.

The Residential Complex

The Mar Aprem Metropolitan Golden Jubilee Housing Scheme, a completed project in Venginisseri, Thrissur is a dream project started by Marth Mariam Valiyapally, Chaldean Syrian Church of the East, Thrissur with a social commitment. 10 houses were constructed for those who lost their houses in the floods and the homeless.
